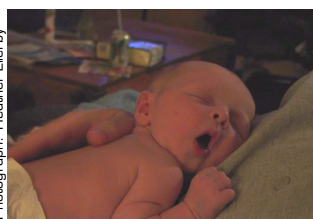

After re-organizing my CD collection (with over 600 CD's, either you keep them organized or you can never find the one you want), I re-discovered my large set of Saga CD's, so I've been playing them to death in the car (where I do most of my critical listening). I think my all-time favourite Saga tune is "Scratching The Surface", from the *Heads Or Tales* release of 1983. I saw the band playing live in 2003 in Mount Forest, at the first gig for new drummer Christian Simpson. Bassist Jim Chrichton told me after the show that Christian "was so nervous, he was ready to hurl the whole show".
